Ghana: Social Work & HIV/AIDS



Description: Students will have the chance to stay 2 weeks in Ghana learning from NGOs and cultural excursions in addition to lectures and assignments in the fields of social work, human rights, and HIV/AIDS. The HIV/AIDS prevalence in Ghana was at 1.3% in 2012. This course will explore the implications of the virus on children, women, and families. Issues of human trafficking, human rights, poverty (environmental sustainability) and social justice will be examined and discussed. This class is open to undergraduate and graduate students.



Price: \$3780 (includes housing, international airfare, 2 meals per day, cultural activities, in-country ground transportation, educational lectures). Does not include tuition for 3 credit hours.

Location: Accra, Ghana

Time: Summer 2014 (travel dates July 6-25)
