We only count the advanced curriculum as the credits the Graduate School requires for graduation. They acknowledge our "foundation" requirements but leave it up to us to monitor all that. What that means is that we can allow exemption from foundation coursework that is similar. Most frequently, that is the research methods course for psych majors but sometimes other content. They can also test out of some content – though our exemption exams are rather rigorous and they are not easy to pass. So students submit syllabi from coursework they believe to be comparable.
