



FACULTY POSITION

Assistant Professor of Social Work

The Social Work faculty at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte are unified in our commitment to diversify the faculty.

The School of Social Work invites applications for an Assistant Professor position. We welcome candidates who demonstrate effectiveness at and a strong commitment to teaching, research, community engagement, and advancing the School and University's diversity initiatives. This position is a full-time, 9-month appointment with an anticipated start date of August 15, 2016

This position will have teaching responsibilities in the BSW, MSW program, and/or the College of Health and Human Services' Health Services Research doctoral program. The School's greatest research and teaching needs are in the areas of child welfare and/or behavioral health. We seek candidates who are primarily able to conduct research in the areas of child welfare and behavioral health. Those with scholarship and teaching in other social work areas are also encouraged to apply. Candidates who teach social work practice are required to have a minimum of two years post-MSW, full-time practice experience and/or equivalent qualifications. Candidates are expected to engage in the following scholarly activities commensurate with the position rank: conduct original research, publish, seek and secure extramural funding, and engage in research mentorship. All faculty members provide service to the University, community, and profession.

Qualifications: Candidates must possess a doctorate in social work or a related field or expect completion of the requirements for a doctorate by August 15, 2016. If a candidate possesses a doctorate in a related field, an MSW from a CSWE-accredited program and two years of full-time post MSW practice experience is required to teach practice courses.

Summary: We welcome candidates with strong academic records, achievement in or the potential for original research and scholarship, success in or the potential to secure external funds for their research, and a commitment to quality teaching, scholarship, community engagement, and diversity and social justice. High priority experience and scholarship needs are Child Welfare and Behavioral Health, but candidates with research expertise in other areas, are also strongly encouraged to apply.

About the University and School: The School of Social Work is located in a new state-of-the-art building within the College of Health and Human Services. Our BSW and MSW Programs are fully accredited by CSWE. UNC Charlotte is the designated urban research university among the 17 universities in The University of North Carolina system and enrolls more than 27,000 culturally diverse students in 80 Bachelors, 64 Masters and 21 Doctoral programs.
