

BSW Professionalism Responses

1. Daniel Durkin: We simply have a form that students sign. Among other things, the students are told that they are expected to abide by the UWF Student Code of Conduct and the NASW Code of Ethics and they sign that they agree to each of these individually.
2. Terry Singer: Our students, in their acceptance letters, are required to indicate that they have read the NASW Code of Ethics and agree to follow it as a condition of their acceptance. We give them the location on our website and will be doing even more to make them aware of it. The University also has a Student Code of Conduct to which the students are held accountable.
3. Julie Miller-Cribbs: This is our student performance policy... we have a level review system for grads and undergrads.

4. *Phyllis Scott: We have a Core Performance Standards Agreement that all students must sign before being fully accepted into the program. At each new student orientation we review these Standards in detail and we use the Core Performance Standards Review (same as agreement but with different signature and processes) for professional development once they are enrolled and when that behavior is so egregious or the student is not receptive to professional development...we move to corrective action and/or termination. Graduate applicants are unable to fully submit their application online without agreeing to these standards and BSW applicants must read and sign at the point of admission. I have attached the standards we use which, again, are the same as the agreement students sign at admission. We made modified last week to address sexual harassment. I hope this helps.
