Illustrate that effective leadership practice is informed and inspired by some of the tools of social work and social work education that you know well. 2. Clarify your leadership challenges and identify strategies to address them. 3. 		<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 4. Understand that effective leadership is context dependent. A person can excel as a leader in one situation but falter in a different operating environment. 5. Help you deal with being in “middle management” between overall institutional leadership and your own faculty, staff, and stakeholders. 6. Enable you to share and learn leadership best practices from one another. <p>Session Background</p> <p>These are tough times for the practice of leadership. Resources are lean, employee attitudes are changing, resignations and retirements abound, and our post-pandemic world continues to lurch from one challenge to the next. And yet, social work practitioners and educators seem singularly qualified to lead in such impossible times.</p> <p>After all, we know well the leadership principles for developing relationships, earning trust, communicating effectively, listening actively, reading signals, challenging assumptions, building emotional intelligence, addressing mental health issues, and championing diversity, equity, inclusion, justice, and accountability. These are all essential components of effective leadership in today’s world. You know these principles better than most professionals since they are central to success in social work and its teaching. And yet, it’s very easy in the daily grind to forget that our education and training prepare us well to meet the complex demands of contemporary leadership.</p> <p>Dr. Jessica McWade will conduct a lively, informative, and inspiring workshop focused on leading well in these impossible times. The session will combine short presentations on these leadership principles with two team breakout sessions (identified below) and several larger-group discussions.
