Position Title: Assistant or Associate Professor of Social Work, Auburn University

Position Summary:

The Auburn University Social Work Program within the Department of Sociology, Anthropology, and Social Work invites applications for a tenure-track position at the Assistant or Associate Professor level, with appointment beginning August 2023. Tenure will be earned in the Department of Sociology, Anthropology, and Social Work.

The candidate's primary appointment will be in the undergraduate program with some teaching responsibilities in the graduate program. The area of expertise is open, but the program is especially interested in candidates with a specialization in child welfare, health, mental health, or health disparities.

Applicants must have an MSW degree from a CSWE accredited program, two years of professional practice experience, and a Ph.D. in Social Work or a related field at the time employment begins. Successful candidates will have a demonstrated ability to conduct scholarly research and publish in peer-reviewed venues, an active, well-articulated research agenda, the potential to secure external grant funding and a record of excellence in teaching commensurate with years of experience. The teaching load is 3/2 across the Social Work curriculum with a reduced load for the first two years (2/2). Courses include generalist and advanced practice methods, introduction to social work, human behavior, or child welfare. This is a full-time, 9-month appointment.

Minimum Qualifications:

1. MSW degree from a CSWE accredited program
2. Two years of professional practice experience
3. Ph.D. in Social Work or a related field at the time employment begins

Desired Qualifications:

1. Established record of scholarly publication (Research)
2. Record of excellence in teaching
3. External funding experience
4. Specialization in one of the focus areas (child welfare, health, mental health, or health disparities)
5. Ability to teach generalist and advanced practice methods, child welfare, introduction to social work, or theory courses.
