- 5. QUESTIONS TO THINK ABOUT --- WHEN LEVERAGING RESEARCH FUNDS, BUILDING RESEARCH CAPACITY AND CONSIDERING CREATING, AUGMENTING OR ENHANCING CENTERS, RESEARCH CENTERS AND RESEARCH CAPACITIES AT SOCIAL WORK EDUCATION PROGRAMS.
 - Centers and capacity-building possibilities -- Infrastructure
 - o Do you have an associate dean or director of research?

- Is there someone designated to be responsible for mentoring, proposal review, organizing research improvement activities, supporting writing groups, sending faculty information on funding opportunities, etc.?
- Do you have statistics and methods expertise and/or consultation available for proposal development and research implementation?
- o Are both senior and junior faculty engaged?
- Is a research center at the school level or the college level for schools embedded within a college [what might be advantages or disadvantages of such a model; what are the interdisciplinary, financial, etc. benefits and challenges]?
- o Are students involved in the center activities?
- o Is the center staffed? At what level? What kind of expertise is needed?
- Are tenure track faculty part of the center or is it developed separately?
- Do you have established mechanisms for boiler plate materials to get grants out the door?
- Do you have a regular working relationship with the IRB and/or the office of sponsored research or the VP for research, etc. at your university?
- Does the center engage a range of faculty?
- o Is the center interdisciplinary?
- Do you collaborate with other disciplines and departments, and/or community agencies?
- Is the impetus from the community, from higher-ups, from the school of social work or from individual faculty?
- Have you received higher level support at your university to assist in building research capacity?
- o Is there the opportunity to buy out faculty time for grant development?
- o What incentives are there for faculty to seek external funds?
- Does the university have specific rules to establish a "research center"
- Do you distinguish between a research center and more topical centers that might do training, program development and evaluation?

External funding

- Does indirect come back to the school and if so how is it used in research enhancement?
- Is their specific funding from foundations or local, state or federal government?
- How stable is the funding source when launching a center
- o How sustainable is the funding?
- Do you plan to (need to) access external funds to build research capacity?
- Do you have faculty who are investigators on federal grants where the
 Principal Investigator is outside of social work or outside of your university –
 how does that work - what is the advantage or disadvantage?
- o Do you have someone who can be helpful with budget preparation?
- Is there a link between training contracts & development of research capacity?

Areas of research

- o If you have created centers are they topic specific?
- Does your school have a particular area of expertise and strength that has been used to marshal external resources?
